# BY THE NUMBERS

#### **Recruitment & Admissions**

- 146 applications received across 3 sites:
  - Madison: 106
  - o Oneida: 27
  - Lac du Flambeau: 13
- 59% of applicants (86) identified as firstgeneration
- 51% (74) reported low-income status
- 43% (63) were both first-generation and lowincome
- An additional 13 applicants were first-gen with uncertain income status, bringing potential financial need to 52%

#### **Enrollment & Retention**

- 169 students enrolled across all sites at the beginning of summer camps in June 2024
- 12 students (7%) voluntarily withdrew (due to personal conflicts)

### **Student Demographics**

- 157 students served across cohorts 2025– 2028
  - 56% first-generation
  - 63% from low-income households

#### Student & Family Feedback

- 93% of families reported being Happy or Very Happy with ITA
- 85% of students reported the same

#### **Choice Sessions**

- 30 sessions offered throughout the year
- Topics ranged from Vision Board for Academic Year to How to Use AI
- Designed to support student identity, interest exploration, and professional growth

#### Alumni Engagement

- 16 alumni expressed interest in volunteering
- 11 alumni participated in panels and mentoring
- 2 alumni served as guest speakers for Get Invested

#### Senior Outcomes: Class of 2025

- 95% of first-gen seniors enrolled in college
- 45% of those first-gen seniors are attending UW-Madison
- 93% of low-income seniors are college-bound
- 37% of low-income seniors are attending UW-Madison
- 49% of all seniors are pursuing STEM or techrelated majors

#### **Fundraising & Community Support**

- \$2,685 raised during Day of the Badger
- Instagram reach grew 2,000%, profile visits increased 920%
- \$852 raised during Brat Fest with 13 volunteers



# PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Throughout the year, ITA scholars engaged in a wide range of hands-on learning experiences designed to foster academic growth, community connection, and exposure to higher education and career pathways. Here are a few standout moments from 2024:



# Senior Residential Experience

ITA held its annual Senior Residential Experience, a key part of our college readiness programming. During this immersive week, seniors lived on campus, explored academic and career interests, and engaged in workshops and community-building activities. For many, it was their first time staying on a college campus—an experience that built confidence, independence, and a stronger commitment to higher education.

# **Campus Day**

ITA Madison held our second annual Campus Day with 20 students in attendance! This event offers Madison-based students a unique opportunity to attend a college lecture, explore campus alongside college students, and visit campus areas beyond our standard programming.



## Oneida End of Year Celebration



The End-of-Semester Gathering brought together students from ITA Oneida site to celebrate their hard work and build community. Held at Oneida Nation High School, the event featured festive activities like gingerbread house building, cookie decorating for elders, holiday movie screenings, and karaoke. Students showed off their creativity through holiday attire and ended the evening with "2 Wishes and a Star," reflecting on accomplishments and sharing goals for the future.

# **Spring Conference**

The Spring Conference brought together students from all three sites for a day of connection and learning. Students participated in community building and a variety of sessions to learn more about academic preparation and technology skills. Seniors also attended the second annual PEOPLE's Badger Signing Day, where they connected with fellow PEOPLE scholars and staff, building relationships and creating a sense of community that they will carry with them into UW-Madison.



## **Road Show**



The ITA Madison Road Show is a culminating event that brings together ITA high school students and 5th graders from Orchard Ridge Elementary School to collaborate on technology-based projects, exposing younger students to creative tech experiences while promoting ITA's mission and sparking early interest in education and careers in technology.



# THE FUTURE OF ITA

As we move into the 2025-2026 year, ITA remains focused on reimagining and refining the student experience through our ongoing Renewal Initiative. The work we began in 2024 is now shaping a more intentional, flexible, and responsive program model that aligns with the evolving needs of our students, families, and communities.

## **SUMMER CAMP UPDATES**

Starting in 2025, ITA will offer shorter, more focused summer camps tailored to each cohort. Our goal is to deliver high-impact, hands-on learning in a more accessible and sustainable format.

## **NEW ACADEMIC YEAR CALENDAR STRUCTURE**

We are transitioning to a new calendar model designed to provide more balanced, consistent programming throughout the academic year. This allows for deeper engagement, reduced scheduling conflicts, and more time for reflection and application of learning.

## **ONLINE COURSES**

We are moving all three sites to a hybrid model. All students will have online course work to provide them with greater flexibility and access. These self-paced modules will include our established and loved curriculum as well as introduction to new content! This will offer students more control over how and when they learn and provide flexibility to be involved in community and high school opportunities.

## IMPROVED PROGRAM INFRASTRUCTURE

Behind the scenes, we are strengthening our internal systems to better support staff and students. From streamlined communications to enhanced data tracking, these improvements will ensure we can scale impact while maintaining quality and care.

With the foundation laid in 2024-2025, we are excited to continue building a more dynamic, innovative, and student-centered ITA.
